Announcement: Wilder Fellowship Opportunities 2023

The Department of Physics and Astronomy invites applications for Wilder Fellowships.

This research fellowship is for an undergraduate doing full-time work in the Department during an off-term. It supports students to pursue a project with a faculty member, who must agree ahead of time to supervise the project. Typically, it is used in the summer term, though it can be any term in which a student is not taking courses.

Applications should be submitted as PDF files. For the research option, the application must include:

- 1) The student's name
- 2) The name of the advisor who has agreed to supervise the project,
- 3) A brief description of the project,
- 4) An estimated schedule for the work, including start and end dates, and
- 5) A listing of other funding, if any, available to support the work.
- 6) On a separate page, the student's Curriculum Vitae, with an emphasis on background in physics and astronomy.

Awards can be for up to 40 hours/week for up to 10 weeks at \$16.25/hour. The eligibility is limited to non-graduating students. Applications should be sent to Meg Whitlock [Megan.P.Whitlock@Dartmouth.edu] no later than Monday, May 1st, as they will be reviewed by the faculty committee that week.
